HISTORICAL NOTE

The Western Postal History Museum (WPHM) was established as a department of the Arizona Pioneers' Historical Museum in 1960 and later became an affiliate. Dr. Ray Brandes, Assistant Director of the Museum, and William Alexander, curator emeritus of stamps and postal history of the Carnegie Museum in Pittsburgh, were the founders. Mr. Alexander, the first Director of the WPHM, started a philatelic education program for asthmatic and underprivileged children in collaboration with the National Foundation for Asthmatic Children. Mr. Arthur Springer succeeded Alexander as the next Director in 1976. As the activities of the WPHM expanded, it outgrew the space initially provided by the Arizona Historical Society and acquired its own building at 920 N. 1st Avenue in Tucson, approximately two blocks away from the original location. The Foundation has always been self-supporting, relying on donations, volunteer time, sales, and small grants to maintain operations. There are currently four departments: philatelic education, a research library, a museum, and a post office contract station.

The official dedication of the WPHM was held in 1969 and in the same year the philatelic education program moved from the Sahuaro School to schools throughout the Tucson Unified School District. Stephen Bechtel donated the necessary funds to purchase the current building in 1978.

SCOPE & CONTENT NOTE

Series 1: Administrative documents

Administrative documents in this series pertain to the foundation as a whole: its mission, projects, and daily operations. Included are the by-laws, memos and minutes, financial statements, and correspondence from and to the directors and chairpeople. Of interest are letters pertaining to the foundation's relationship with the Arizona Historical Society and the search for a new building to house the foundation (its current location). Similar items more specific to departments, such as Education, as well as more personal documents from the directors, will be found in the Departments and Staff series.

Series 2: Member and public relations

Included in this series are publicity materials created by and for the foundation to recruit members and inform the public, documents relating to foundation-wide community events, and

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newspaper clippings about the foundation. Similar items more specific to departments (such as Education) will be found in the Departments and staff series. Documents pertaining to events that are specifically related to philately, such as the Western Postal History Conference, are found in the Postal history and philatelic events series.

Series 3: Departments and staff

Documents in the Departments and staff series include correspondence, publicity, and information related directly to specific departments at the foundation. Of interest are the materials from the Education department and the early work with asthmatic children. Also contained in this series is biographical information about the directors and chairpeople as well as specific staff from their respective departments.

Series 4: Postal history and philatelic events

During the 1960s and early 1970s, the foundation was involved in the well-attended Western Postal History Conferences. This series contains planning notes, programs, and photocopied photographs from these conferences. Also contained in this series are notes, correspondence, and programs from the seminars headed by Director Doug Kelsey in the late 1980s and early 1990s.

Series 5: Slusser construction

Documents, correspondence, drawings, specifications, blueprints, and other materials related to the construction of the Slusser Library (ca. 1993-1996) are in this series. This series not only tells the story of the construction process, but also provides details of the existing building.

Series 6: Photographs

Photographs from all aspects of the foundation are included in this series and are arranged similar to the arrangement of series 1 – 4. Depending on the contents of each folder, some smaller photographs are housed separately.
