
I expect 2006 to be another series of positive, well-focused "firsts" and look forward to sharing our good news throughout the upcoming year.

G.Ross Award, given for his distinguished service to stamp collecting.


PHF member Tito Palacios, was recently elected President of the Tucson Stamp Club. Best of luck to him in his new position.

The event featured a full color guard, US Marine "Easy Company", American Legion member Gary Harlan playing Taps, formal unveiling of the Distinguished Marines stamp by the new Tucson USPS Postmaster Carl Grigel, local opera singer Beverly Gibson rendering an emotional National Anthem, lots of good food (donated by Trader Joe's), a WWII stamp exhibit, a special cancellation and cachets, and plenty of great memories for the veterans.


