




These photos are a small sampling of the many classroom and community events Paul has attended. Lucky for us, he continues to volunteer for presentations whenever he is available.

ed in promoting youth philately. One teacher has emailed us "I used the stamp activity with my students and they were really into it. It will become part of my teaching repertoire." Our seminars demonstrated that the word "history" in our name is a meaningful desciptor. The Slusser Library materials sparked much interest. especially with midwestern and eastern philatelists, and pointed out the need to actively promote the existence of this "treasure".

John Birkinbine presented two hour seminars on "The Butterfield Overland Mail" and "The Civil War in the West: Union and Confederate Postal History in New Mexico, Arizona and California". These were well received by 40+ individuals attending each session.

The Arizona Rangers banquet featured an outstanding dinner and entertainment by Derrick Suwaima Davis, a Hopi/Choctaw Native American and four time World Champion Hoop Dancer. He was sponsored by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries of NYC. The talk of the night centered on the "Presidential Dessert", a white chocolate replica of the White House filled with chocolate mousse. Over 60 people were present, including new Ranger, Dr. Hubert Skinner of New Orleans. This number was remarkable because competition to attend dinners was intense.The evening closed with the presentation of a Stupell crystal bowl as a special prize to postal historian Richard Winter.

Another highlight was the Foundation's unique Colorado Silk cachet, designed by artist Chris Calle, featuring a Native American in magnificent headdress. It was the only cachet of its type at the show. It is truly a work of art and available to members through our Sales Dept.

Volunteer Spotlight

One of the hallmarks of the PHF is the good humor which abounds. The featured volunteers are all known for their positive spirit and superior joke/storytelling skills. Their fun loving attitudes are appreciated by customers, volunteers and staff alike. Be sure to stop by to meet these jovial fellows!

Bob Davis spent his childhood in Chicago, then moved west to Los Angeles and Phoenix. He served as a Navy pilot in the Vietnam War from 1963-68. For 33 years, he flew commercial jets for Western and Delta Airlines. His family includes 3 children and 4 grandchildren, for whom he often serves a head baby-sitter. You may find this clan frequently sky bound, as his wife, son and daughter-in-law all hold pilots licenses! His stamp collecting began

as a boy and waned in adulthood until he got hooked again through auctions about 10 years ago. Philatelic interests include early French, Netherlands and US cancels. He stays active with the hobby through EBay buying and selling "just for the fun of it". His knowledge is a great help to the PHF, as Bob assists with determining stamp values. He has a regular shift running the post office and answers phones. His strong belief in enjoying life is obvious to all as he provides a steady diet of humorous tales and jokes to everyone at the PHF.

Jim Kelly, another of our volunteer postmasters, hails from Rhode Island. Greatly influenced by the sea, he served in the Navy during the Korean War. He moved to Tucson in 1956 to attend the University of AZ School of Architecture and worked in facility management for 30 years. He and his wife Nancy then built a rammed earth house in rural Dragoon, Arizona which they operated as a bed & breakfast. In 1996, they returned to Tucson. Jim recollects collecting stamps as a boy. He came to see what the PHF had to offer about 4 years ago and signed on to help run the post office. In addition, Jim's superior "fixit skills" are often utilized with special projects around the facility.

John Wynns is a third generation Californian who also served in the Navy during the Vietnam War. Born in Los Angeles, he attended Pierce College and Cal State at Northridge, majoring in history and political science. His work experience included service as a USPS courier/clerk and working in the Mojave Desert on aqueduct and reservoir systems. Upon retirement, he relocated to Tucson so he could utilize the PHF resources. His stamp collecting started at age 8 when his grandfather got him interested in stamps. A member of APS since 1969, John considers himself a serious collector of British Colonies, U.S. Possessions and Canadian. In 2003, he became a member of the Rangers. He exhibited publicly for the first time at ARIPEX 2006, noting how much fun it is to see one's hard work up in frames He describes his home as being "stuffed" with stamp collections and a sizable philatelic library. John states "I have found my niche" in philately. His love for historical literature and stamps makes him an ideal person to volunteer in the Slusser Library, where he enjoys locating research materials for collectors and assisting with library tasks.
