The PHF netted \$2000 from the sale of surplus material and Pollination Stamp cachets.



#### **Volunteer Spotlight**



Larry Daly began volunteering in 1998 as part of his annual winter residency in Tucson. Born and raised in Massachusetts, he collected stamps as a kid, starting with U.S. because they were easy to acquire. When asked to write a school geography report, he chose Nepal, having seen an article on it in National Geographic Magazine and because "it was alot

smaller than Asia". It was difficult to acquire stamps from Nepal, but fortunately the public library subscribed to Linn's. At 13, he read about stamp albums for sale and a collection of early Nepal for \$5.10 and thus began his foray into the collecting world. He had a paper route to earn money so he could explore stamp auctions and new issue dealers.

After graduating from Boston College, he worked as an Army chemical engineer and began his world travels. Upon visiting China, he gained interest in Chinese stamps and now has a collection of all PRC stamps, except one. Other collections include Tibet and Antarctica. Retiring to New Jersey in 1995, he began trekking China, Nepal and (this fall) Bhutan. Besides hiking,he stays active with theatre arts and music,and is a member of APS, China Stamp Society and American Society of Polar Philatelists. He hopes to assemble his collections into exhibits in the future.

Larry found the PHF through a Linn's article, took a tour and wanted to give something in return so decided to volunteer. He helps sort,file, has reorganized our filing system, runs the post office and has even joined the AZ Rangers. He especially enjoys having access to our library where he can keep up with current philatelic literature. You can find him here mid-December through mid-April, along with his fascinating tales of far East mountain treks.
